

Chlamydia - Easy Read Information




Chlamydia is a common sexually transmitted infection (STI).

It can be passed from person to person if you have unprotected sex (sex without a condom).

Men and women can get chlamydia.



Chlamydia is hard to see and some people d o not have any symptoms.





If you have these signs or symptoms you need to go to your doctors or Sexual Health Clinic.



Chalmydia can be easily treated with tablets.

You must not have sex till you have finishedyour tablets.



Using condoms every time you have sex can help stop you getting an STI.
