

## Chlamydia – Easy Read Information



Chlamydia is a common sexually transmitted infection (STI).

It can be passed from person to person if you have unprotected sex (sex without a condom).

Men and women can get chlamydia.



Chlamydia is hard to see and some people do not have any symptoms.



Sometimes you can have signs of chlamydia these might be: -

- Tummy pain below the belly button
- Pain when peeing
- Pain during sex
- Discharge (liquid) from the vagina or penis

Women can have bleeding after sex or between periods.

Men can have pain in their testicles (balls).



If you have these signs or symptoms you need to go to your doctors or Sexual Health Clinic.



Chlamydia can be easily treated with tablets.

You must not have sex till you have finished your tablets.



Using condoms every time you have sex can help stop you getting an STI.
